All of these have different procedures and protocols. If you hear your child's school is in an Emergency Procedure, please DO NOT come to or call the school.

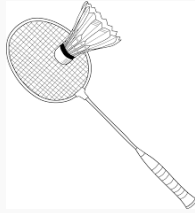
