## Wildlife on Playground

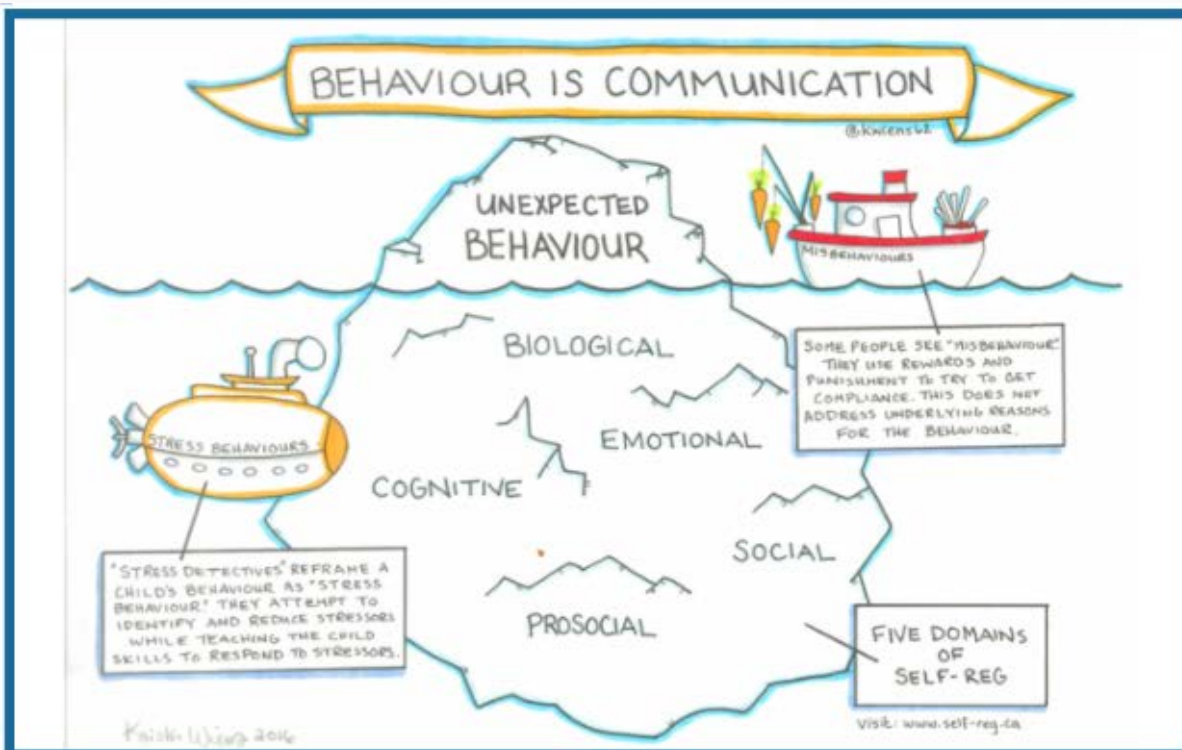
